PCN STEERING COMMITTEE

In 2024, Ontario Health (OH) directed OHTs to engage primary care in establishing Primary Care Networks (PCNs). In response, the Primary Health Care Clinicians Table (PHCCT) requested the merger of similar groups (PHCCT, Primary Care Project Team and IPC Team) to form the Great River OHT PCN Steering Committee. The Primary Care Project Team has been sunset, with IPC Team representation now added to the PHCCT, and two Lived Experience Partners included to broaden perspectives. Over the next 12-24 months, additional groups may also join.

The PCN Steering will operate under the current PHCCT Terms of Reference until the PCN Toolkit from OH is released. This will provide guidance for governance and project development as the PCN matures, with primary care projects becoming working groups under the PCN Steering Committee.



Potential working groups under consideration include Heart Failure Integrated Care Pathway Working Group and Diabetes Standardized Management Working Group leveraging the four DEP's developed Stepped Care work. Furthermore, the Great River OHT has reserved two seats for MDs and NPs at the decision-making table (Steering Committee). It's crucial that priorities and funding decisions are co-led by clinicians like you to ensure they align with your needs. OPTIMIZING HEART FAILURE MANAGEMENT WEBINAR

On January 15th, the PCN hosted a 2-hour virtual event, "Optimizing Heart Failure Management Webinar," attended by over 30 physicians and nurse practitioners.
